There should also be more to come from course and distance winners **MIDNIGHT RIVER** and Il Ridoto with the former looking the more solid.

Race 1: JCB Triumph Hurdle (13:30)

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Lossiemouth looked unlucky when chasing home stablemate **GALA MARCEAU** in the Spring Hurdle, but the winner is worth sticking with, especially given that race's strong record in providing winners of this one. Stablemate Blood Destiny, an impressive winner of both starts since coming from France, has been kept fresh, and is respected accordingly.

Race 2: McCoy Contractors County Handicap Hurdle (14:10)

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Filey Bay hasn't yet stopped improving and is a big player once more after his run behind Aucunrisque, but this race has fallen to well-treated novices in two of the last three seasons and recent Grade 2 runner-up **PEMBROKE** first the bill. Gin Coco lost little in defeat when last seen but is higher in the weights, and Winter Fog has the same problem to overcome.

Race 3: Albert Bartlett Novices' Hurdle (14:50)

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Corbetts Cross produced an exceptional performance when winning over two miles last time, but that may have taken plenty out of him, and preference instead is for **MONTY'S STAR**. His Clonmel win looks very solid and his connections have a good record in this race. Stablemate Hiddenvalley Lake, who chased him home that day, links several of these rivals, and is a big player.

Bravemansgame looks the pick of the British runners.

Bob And Co has twice failed to complete in this race, while Chris's Dream looks to have been rejuvenated by the switch to point-to-points. The prolific Famous Clermont is respected too.

The strong stayer Cool Survivor and the progressive Iroko are others to consider.
